## Bastille Day (La fête nationale du 14 juillet)

In 1789, France was ruled by the monarchy. The general population of France was poor and hungry, whilst the monarchy had everything they wanted. This meant that the people got angry at the monarchy, particularly the King, Louis XVI.

The people of France protested, but the King did not pay attention. So, on 14 July 1789, the protestors met at the Bastille prison, a symbol of the totalitarian authority of the King. They broke in and freed the prisoners.



This event marked the start of the French Revolution, which led to the *Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen* in France in August 1789. The first article of the Declaration reads 'Men are born and remain free and equal in rights.'

The King tried to flee with his family, including the queen, Marie-Antoinette, but was caught and guillotined in 1793.

July 14<sup>th</sup> has become a symbol of freedom, democracy and the desire to



fight against any kind of dictatorship or oppression. July 14<sup>th</sup> officially became the French national festival in 1880.

Nowadays, 14<sup>th</sup> July is a bank holiday in France. There are firework displays and celebrations across the country. In Paris, there is a large military parade.
